Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul

There are only 17 Solemnities found in the Calendar of Roman Catholic Church. One of them is the great feast which we celebrate tomorrow, June 29 – that of Sts. Peter and Paul. These two heroic saints are invoked as “great Luminaries of the Church.” From the earliest days of Christianity, their lives shine with the brilliance of God’s grace and the apostolic zeal with which they served. As we know, St. Peter was the “rock” on which Christ built His Church. He was given the keys to heaven as the first Pope, the first Vicar of Christ on earth. His relationship with Christ is a powerful witness to the reality that “God’s power is made perfect in weakness.” Scripture recounts his faults as well as his triumphs. St. Paul’s life was completely changed, through an encounter with Christ, as he was persecuting Christians. His life after that was marked with bold preaching, writing and evangelizing throughout the then known world. Both of these saints lived and died for Christ. Take time this week to reflect on their Letters in the New Testament and invoke their intercession.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

We read in the Letter of St. James: “Are there people sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church, and let the priests pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick persons, and the Lord will raise them up.”

Often confused with “The Last Rites,” the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just for the dying—it is for any Catholic whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age. The purpose of this sacrament is to give sick persons the strength and grace to bear sufferings bravely and to fight against evil. This sacrament forgives venial sins and strengthens the sick person against temptations and anxiety. It is intended to bring about first and foremost the healing of the soul and, if it is God’s plan, the healing of their body as well. With this in mind, it is very appropriate for Catholics to receive this sacrament *at the beginning* of a serious illness and not to deprive the sick of the graces of the sacrament until death seems likely or even imminent. This also allows for the sick person to be fortified by the graces of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Holy Communion as well. “The Last Rites” actually refers to three sacraments: the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Anointing of the Sick, and Holy Communion (called

Though all three of those sacraments are repeatable, when they are received one final time before death, we refer to them collectively as “The Last Rites.” In order to provide the best pastoral care possible for our parishioners, priests are available to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick individually at any time. If you or a loved one is seriously ill, you are encouraged to call the Ministry Center to set up an appointment to celebrate the sacrament at your home, the hospital, or in church. Priests are also available on short notice for emergencies. A priest is on-call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and can be reached by calling the Ministry Center (419-695-4050) at any time.
